Shared Lunch

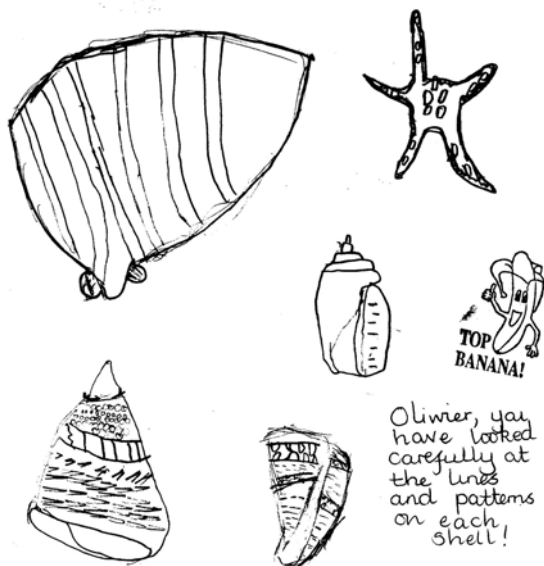

SPORTS' DAYS

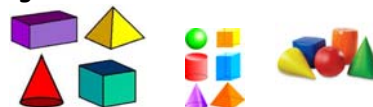
These popular occasions will be organised as follows:
